### **FAQs for Homeschool Teachers**

#### **Digital Latin resources**

##### **What is Cambridge GO?**

Cambridge GO is our digital learning platform. It includes digital versions of the resources and a variety of supplementary material. You can purchase digital subscriptions for the Student's Book and the Teacher's Manual. Cambridge GO can be accessed on your laptop/desktop computer or by downloading the Cambridge Reader app to your tablet or phone.

##### **What does the Digital Student's Book include?**

The Digital Student's Book contains links to language exercises, story dramatizations and video documentaries. There are also all the stories which can be viewed, some have comprehension questions, all have audio, and all have a dictionary and a story explorer.

##### **What does the Digital Teacher's Manual include?**

Within the Digital Teacher's Manual you will find assessments, the Teacher's Manual itself, and printable worksheets for the students to use. Teacher's Manual also includes access to the Student's Book. A teacher needs access to both the Student's Book and the Teacher's Manual to be able to teach the course. The Digital Teacher's Manual covers all four units of the Course.

##### **How do I purchase digital access to the North American Cambridge Latin Course 5th edition?**

The digital resources can be purchased as a one-year subscription. To purchase an access code, contact customer services at [worldlanguagesonline@cambridge.org](mailto:worldlanguagesonline@cambridge.org) or call 1-800-872-7423 (9:00 am – 5:00 pm Eastern Time).

##### **What do I do when my digital subscription expires?**

After your one-year subscription has elapsed, you will need to purchase a new code. Your book's expiry date is displayed on the Cambridge GO resources screen. 5<sup>th</sup> edition users need to email [worldlanguagesonline@cambridge.org](mailto:worldlanguagesonline@cambridge.org). Once you have the new code, there's no need to create a new account. You simply log in with your current account and click 'add new resource' to get access to the new subscription.

### Teaching the North American Cambridge Latin Course

#### How much time should I spend on a unit?

The pacing, for most home school situations, is Unit I for one year, Unit II for the next to equal Latin I. This is achievable at 1.5 hours per week. Most of class time is spent reading the model sentences and asking questions, asking questions about the stories that they read, going over whatever homework that has been assigned, and explaining concepts – mostly language related.

#### What should I set as homework?

The students often do the quizzes and tests on their own time and read the stories on their own as homework.

#### Can I access training on teaching with the Cambridge Latin Course?

The Teacher's Manual is a *sine qua non* for teaching the Cambridge Latin Course and includes a variety of teaching ideas and helpful hints.
